# **Syllables**

The Coptic word may consist of one or more syllables.

## Types of syllables:

- 1. Open syllable which ends with a vowel: e.g. **!! & :** Place
- 2. Closed syllable which ends with a consonant :

e.g. ww : to read

A syllable is a part of a word which consist of :

- 1. A vowel
- 2. Two vowels compounded into one sound (&1).
- 3. Consonant and a vowel.
- 4. Consonant with jinkim ( $\hat{\Pi}$ ).
- 5. Consonant and a compound sound ( $\Phi \lambda I$ ).
- 6. More than one consonant and a vowel (20以7:three {3}).

Dividing the word into syllables facilitates reading.

### Examples:

1) Two syllable word :  $8a|\kappa i$  : city
2) Three syllable word : uo|na|xoc : monk
3) Four syllable word : uo|na|xoc : like, as

4) Five syllable word:  $\varepsilon v |\lambda 0| \Im H |u \varepsilon| NOC$ : blessed
